

THE STREETS



The historical heart of Senlis is composed of paved lanes with a central gutter; the numerous stone bollards, designed to prevent the wheels from damaging the walls, are characteristic of the medieval ages.

In the Middle-Ages, some streets were named after the occupation of their inhabitants; for example: Rue de la Tonnellerie (cooperage), Rue de la Tannerie (tannery), rue de la Treille (vine arbour)...

Other street names arouse curiosity such as Rue de la Poulallerie (Poultry), Rue des Pigeons blancs (white pigeons), Rue du Chat Haret (wild cat), Rue aux Flageards (fallow)...
